HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Government Science College, Chatrapur is the only government college and premier colleges of Chatrapur sub-division. The untiring efforts of the few dedicated and enlighted souls of Chatrapur for over a decade resulted in the establishment of this college on July, 8, 1969 under a private management with only arts and science streams. The college then made rapid strides. First year degree course in Arts and pre-professional classes in science started in 1970. It was accorded affiliation for the second-year degree class during 1970-71 and the following year the college was full-fledged with arts stream. Science classes of degree pass started in 1976-77 with 32 seats each in PCM and CBZ. Honours in economics and political science started in 1977 and 1978 respectively. During 1980-81, this college recorded a significant progress in starting the commerce stream. History honours and zoology honours started in the same session and English honours in the following session.

A new era began in 1982, when the private management was taken over by the government. Thereafter, teaching in number of honours and the post-graduate were introduced. This momentous event ushered in a new ray of hope and optimism with the introduction of 10+2+3 pattern in Higher education, Odisha I 1983 and the three-year degree course was introduced in 1985. Physics and chemistry honours started in 1989-90.

College was accorded affiliation in commerce degree stream in 1990-91 session. Botany Honours started in 1991-1992. In 1993-94 session, honours in Odia and Commerce and Mathematics honours for both Science and Arts started. College added one more feather in its cap by opening post-graduation in Odia and History in the year 1997 and was declared one of the lead colleges of Government of Odisha.

Odisha state open university was opened in the year 2021 with post-graduate and undergraduate courses in Arts and Commerce stream. It started in Onslow institute since its infancy till 1980, when it has its own building. By this time, a commerce block, science block, library building, reading room, auditorium and the Odia department building were added.



- 1. University/Institute can add/delete some experiments of similar nature in the laboratory papers.
- 2. The size of practical group for practical papers is recommended to be 12-15 students.
- 3. College can add up to 20 additional credits if required. For Example, if a certificate course in Vocational subjects is to be taken, 18 credits can be added.

Draft Model Regulation for Under Graduate Programme (BA/B. Com/B.Sc.)

To be followed by Berhampur University

(Applicable to Autonomous Colleges/Affiliated Colleges/DDCE)

1. Eligibility:

- 1.1. Higher Secondary / +2 / Senior Secondary or any other equivalent examination passed from a board / council established by the Govt. of India or any State Govt or any other equivalent examination recognized by central board of secondary education / council of higher secondary education, Govt. of Odisha / Dept. of Higher Education / Dept of Industry or any other department of Govt. of Odisha or Utkal University. Those joining B.Sc. programme must have passed the above examination under the faculty of science/Technology/Engineering/Pharmacy etc. There shall be no such restriction for joining BA/B. Com stream.
- 1.2. Students ordinarily may be selected for admission through Entrance test. Group Discussion and personal interview and a combination of these with due weightages to career to be decided by the Autonomous college or Director. Higher Education DDCE would admit students on first come first serve basis. The Govt. of Odisha may lay down admission process for colleges under its control.
- 1.3 Admission Policy would be decided by the Academic Council of the respective Autonomous colleges.
- 1.4 Directorate of Distance & Continuing Education would decide its own admission policy.

2. **Duration:**

- 2.1. At least three years of six semester in to two. In case of professional courses, the duration may be more as per the direction of regulatory bodies established under Law.
- 2.2. Odd semester is from June to December (i.e., 1st, 3rd, 5th) semester, The examination shall be held normally in the month of November December.

- 2.3. Even semester is from January to June (i.e., 2nd, 4th,6th)semester. The examination shall be held normally in the month of May-June. However, the Final semester shall be conducted in April and result shall be published by end of May.
- 2.4. A student would be required to complete the course within six academic years from the date of admission.
- 2.5. A student may opt for fast track of completing all the six semesters in two years provided she/he has at least 2 years industry/ organizational experience after +2. Such permission would be granted at the discretion of the principal of the autonomous college and DDCE. This clause shall not be applicable to affiliated non autonomous colleges.

3. Compulsory Registration for 1st Semester

- 3.1 Registration for 1st semester is compulsory. A candidate admitted to +3 course but not registered for 1st semester examination his/her admission will be automatically cancelled.
- 3.2 A candidate may take a blank semester: A blank semester has to be clubbed with next Odd or Even semester as the case may be i.e., 2nd, 4th and 6th/1st,3rdand 5th. The hostel policy for blank semester is to be decided by colleges as per their suitability. Hostel accommodation cannot be claimed as a right for blank semester. (Blank semester is not to be confused as repetition due to failure).
- 3.3 75% attendance for non DDCE students is a requirement for being eligible to appear at examination up to 15% waiver may be granted by the college principal at discretion on health ground or participation in sports cultural activities NCC and NSS activities etc.
- 3.4 A student may clear backlog papers within 6 years. Improvement if any has to be completed within 4 years.
- 3.5 A student may register for extra credit i.e. register for additional papers under the same faculty or outside the faculty under an autonomous college or DDCE provided they are in a position to facilitate such teaching.

- 5.2. A transitory letter grade I (carrying points 2) shall be introduced for cases where the results are incomplete This grade shall automatically be converted into appropriate grade(s) as and when the results are complete.

- (c) A student in order to retain honors has to secure Grade C and above in each of the core papers. Further in order to obtain distinction a student has to secure Grade C in all the paper in 1st appearance.
- 5.4. In addition to the points marks / percentage would also be awarded and shall also be reflected in the mark sheet.
- 5.5. The details of grading system shall be printed on the backside of University of Mark Sheet.

6. Repeat Examination:

- 6.1. A student has to clear back papers (i.e., in the paper/papers one has failed) by appearing at subsequent semester examinations within six years from the date of admission.
- 6.2. A student may appear improvement(repeat) in any number of papers in the immediate subsequent examination. The higher marks shall be retained.
- 6.3. Improvement has to be completed with 4 years from the date of admission.

7. Hard Case Rule:

- 7.1. 2% of grace mark on the aggregate mark subject to maximum of 5 mark in single paper shall be given. This shall be applicable in each semester.
- 7.2. 0.5 grace mark can be given for award of B Grade in each semester provided under 6.1 has not been awarded.

8. Examination Questions Pattern(Suggestive):

8.1. For subject without having practical full marks are 100 per paper out of which 20 marks is allotted for mid semester examination(internal) and 80 marks for end semester examination.

The question papers shall be divided into two parts such as Group A and Group B.

Group A will carry 10 short questions of two marks each. The answer should be within two sentences.

There shall be 5 long type question in Group – B and all questions shall be of equal value.

For subjects with practical full marks are 100 per paper out of which 20 marks allotted for mid semester examination.

50 is for end semester examination and 30 is for practical.

The question papers shall be divided into two parts such as Group A and Group B.

Group A will carry 10 short questions of one mark each and the answer should be within two sentences.

There shall be 5 questions carrying 12 marks each. Practical will carry 30 marks out of which 10 will be for records.

a. Model answers should be between 700-1000 words.

- 9. Each dept shall have a designated teacher in charge of examination to be decided by principal in addition to the controller of examinations of the college(applicable to autonomous colleges).
- 10. The evaluation would be sole responsibility of teacher offering the course.
- 11. Suitable modifications may be made by the autonomous colleges keeping in view of the UFC guideline for autonomous colleges. University guidelines from time to time and state govt. guidelines from time to time.

• Broad Principles of Credit Transfer:

There should be a small group to consider all cases of credit transfer. The group should consists of the following Chairman – P.G Council (for University affiliated colleges)/Director,
DDCE for DDCE/ Principals of the Autonomous College.
Convener– Dy. Controller of examination for university affiliated colleges.
– Faculty member of DDCE for DDCE, controller of
Examination of respective autonomous colleges for
autonomous colleges.
Members – Four teachers to be nominated by the chairman.PG
Council/ Director

Waiver for courses covered under other colleges not withstanding differences in detailed course can be granted. Papers which one has not studied even though they are prescribed for earlier semesters can be covered by the students.

> Other Broad Principles:

Students transferred after 1st semester examination cannot be given position or medal under autonomous colleges. Students who have failed/remained absent/ appeared for improvement shall not be eligible for university gold medal or rank students who have been granted credit waiver under credit transfer system can't be awarded gold medal or position.

2. HIGHER SECONDARY COURSES

The college is affiliated to the council of higher secondary education (Odisha) for the purpose of preparing the students for the +2 Arts, +2 Science, +2 Commerce Examinations.

- 2. A student may take MIL (Hindi/Telugu/Bengali/Urdu) for which there is no teaching provision.
- 3. CHSE (O) may in special circumstances permit a candidate to offer alternative English in lieu of MIL stating reasons.
- 4. A student is required to refer to the course of studies published by the CHSE(O) for further details.

3. REGISTRATION OF NAMES

Every student of degree classes is ipso facto a registered student of Berhampur University and every student of Higher Secondary Education course is ipso facto a registered student of the Council of Higher secondary education, Odisha. This registration is essential for permission to sit for examinations conducted by the University/Council.

4. ATTENDANCE AT LECTURES AND PRACTICAL

Each year a student is required to attend in each subject a minimum of 75% lectures (Practical calculated separately) in order to be eligible for promotion to the next higher class or for being sent up for the Degree / Higher Secondary Examination.

5. TIME TABLE

Time table, Identity card and Library card are provided to the students at the beginning of the academic session. Students are required to collect these from the office counter / library counter.

6. **ADMISSION**

+2 e-Admn. Code – 11321101 +3 e-Admn. Code – 11321302 Admission in the college cannot be claimed as a matter of right and may be refused by the principal without assigning reasins to the candidates.

Conduct of the candidates shall be an important factor in deciding the prayer for admission to the college.

ELLIGIBILITY

The eligibility for admission inti +3 Arts/Science/Commerce stream is as follows:

- 1. Arts: Should have passed +2 Science/Arts/Commerce or its equivalent
- 2. **Science:** Should have passed +2 science or its equivalent.
- 3. **Commerce:** Should have passed +2 science /Arts /Commerce or its equivalent.

The eligibility for admission into +2 H.S $1^{\rm st}$ year Arts/Commerce/Science is as follows: -

1. Arts/Science/Commerce: Should have passed HSC (BSE Odisha) or CBSE(Delhi) or ICSE (New Delhi) or its equivalent examination run by any other Board/University. Date line of admission is decided y the DHE Odisha.

7. RESERVATION OF SEATS

Out of the total number of sanctioned strength in each class of +2/+3/PG Wing for Schedule Caste, for Schedule Tribe, 2% for Burma Repatriates, 5% for Odia students living in neighbouring state, 1% for children of serving defence personnel, 2% for Children/ Grandchildren of Sahid Soldiers/Swadhinata Sangramee. The students are required to mention their reserve category for seat in their admission application form.

Total Weightage available is limited to 10%. For details refer admission instructions and prospectus prescribed by the Dept. of Higher Education, Odisha.

9. IDENTITY CARD

- i) Each student of the college is issued with an identity card to testify the holder's status as a student of Government Science College, Chatrapur. Students should be in possession of their identity cards whenever they are inside the college campus. Identity cards must be produced as and when called for. Anyone who fails to produce the identity card on demand shall be treated as a trespasser.
- ii) Loss of identity card must be reported to the principal immediately.
- iii) A duplicate identity card may be issued to the student who losses the original identity card on payment of fees of Rs. 40/- and an affidavit to the effect.
- iv) The second year and final year students should renew their identity cards every year till they attend the classes as regular students.

10. PERMISSION TO VISIT OUTSIDE

- i) When a team of students is deputed by the college to go outside Chatrapur members of the team and guide accompanying the team must obtain permission from the principal before their departure from Chatrapur.
- ii) A GROUP OF STUDENTS WITH GUIDE OR WITHOUT GUIDE(Students or teacher) going outside the campus/town for any purpose, without prior permission from the principal on any date will be considered as the unauthorized absence and college authority will no way be held responsible for any type of happenings. As it violates the conduct rule of both students and the guide, stringent action will be taken against them.

11. PARTICIPATION IN COLLEGE ELECTION

Students have the right to participate in elections of various societies in conformity with the constitution of those societies, but in no circumstances, they should indulge in party or group politics, which will be detrimental to academic interests. Election shall be conducted as per Lingdo Commission Report.

12. Conduct inside the class room

A Student should behave in the class room in a disciplined manner and be attentive to the lecture, in no circumstances shall the teaching be interrupted by any student in class room.

13. Concerted absence

Concreted absence without leave for one or more days on the part of the students is a serious breach of college discipline.

14. Absence during college examination

A student who absents himself/herself from college examinations without obtaining permission from the principal shall be penalized. Willful absence from college examination may cause a detention in the same class.

15. Participation in extracurricular activities

- i) Students are expected to participate, in the extracurricular activities of the College but in all meetings and cultural functions they should conduct themselves with decency and decorum. The unusual behavior of any student on such occasion shall be considered as an act of gross indiscipline.
- ii) Students should not leave the hall in the midst of any College meeting unless it is unavoidable.

16. Payment of college fees and other dues

- i) Fees are received in the College office on the dates fixed for collection of fees.
- ii) If a student fails to pay tuition fees and other dues on the scheduled date his name shall be struck off.
- iii) For re-admission he shall be required to pay a usual admission fee as readmission fees. The principal may in exceptional circumstances, exempt the readmission fee.
- iv) College tuition fee and other charges, if any, for the remaining months of the academic session will be realized from a student before he is allowed to fill up the Application form for University / Council Examination.
- v) Declaration of the results of the Annual / Test Examination will be withheld in case of nonpayment of college dues / Library dues / NCC / NSS / Games dues.

17. Transfer certificate

- i) A Transfer / College Leaving may be issued to a student on payment of all dues and on production of clearance certificate from all concerned. The opinion of the Proctor will be taken into consideration while recording remarks about the student.
- ii) A duplicate Transfer Certificate may be issued to a student on furnishing an undertaking in writing to the effect that the original T.C. was not used for securing admission into any educational institution and on payment of a fee of Rs.3/- only. The student should also submit an affidavit mentioning the circumstances in which the original T.C. was lost and reason of present need of duplicate T.C. and where to be produced. Duplicate T.C. cannot be issued with incomplete affidavit.

18. Rules to be strictly adhered

- i) Spitting on the walls, pillars or doors of the College is strictly prohibited.
- ii) Scribbling, pasting placards or posters and disfiguring college walls will be viewed seriously.
- iii) Tampering with light and fan switches and fittings is a serious offence.
- iv) Displacing or damaging furniture in the classroom is strictly forbidden.
- v) Loitering on the verandah or in front of classroom is prohibited.
- vi) Student shall not enter the College, Account Section, Staff Common Room or Principal's Room without permission.
- vii) Cycles must be padlocked and kept in the place specified for cycle parking. Cycles should not be kept on the College verandahs or corridors.
- viii) Students should stand in a queue while transacting business at the Library and Office Counters.
- ix) No student should tamper with the notices displayed on the Notice Board.He may be the one to miss the notice next time.
- x) Student should prove themselves worthy of their Alma mater, the community and the country.
- xi) Student should come with proper uniform & valid Identity Card, which she/he should produce as and when required.

21. Proctorial System

Proctorial system has been introduced for development of intimate relationship between the students and teachers and for timely guidance and advice in academic and other matters. Under this system a batch of sixteen to twenty students are entrusted to the charge of a teacher whom the students meet to put forth their difficulties or for advice.

The student shall furnish the required information to the Proctor for the maintenance of the Proctorial record. No student shall ordinarily leave the headquarters without informing the Proctor.

No help from any source or any other form of assistance will be given to student unless recommended by the Proctor. The promotion in the college examinations and the issue of the final conduct and transfer certificate from the College will also be based on proctorial record of a student during the period of his/her study in the College. Information about classes and other matters in respect of every student is sent to the guardian from time to time and also shown on the notice board.

Any adverse report against a student by the Proctor will be seriously viewed.

22. Fees and Subscriptions

e) Exemption from Payment of Tuition Fee & Admission Fee

- i) Students belonging to Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes are exempted from payment of tuition fees.
- ii) Women students and blind students are exempted from payment of tuition fees.
- iii) For the children of Government servants who die in harness, exemption from payment of tuition fee may be granted subject to satisfactory progress.
- iv) Children of Government servants should be exempted from payment of readmission fee and transfer fee consequent upon the transfer of their parents from one place to another during the middle and at the beginning of the academic year.

23. SCHOLARSHIP, STIPENDS & FINANCIAL AIDS

A) SCHOLARSHIP & STIPEND

The following scholarships and stipends are available to eligible students studying in this college. Details can be had from the officer – in – charge of scholarship.

i) National Scholarship

It is awarded on the basis of merit in the Annual H.S.C. Examination. Ordinarily students who have secured 70% or more marks in aggregate at H.S.C. Examination are likely to win this scholarship. The annual income of parents should not exceed Rs.6,00,000/-.

ii) National Loan Scholarship

50% of marks in the qualifying (H.S.C. / C.H.S.E.) Examination with the annual income of parents not exceeding Rs.6000/- renders a student's eligible to apply for National Loan Scholarship.

iii) Senior College Merit Scholarship

Awarded to the student of Degree Classes on the basis of C.H.S.E. Examination marks (at least 50%). The value of the Scholarship is Rs.50/- per month.

iv) Junior College Merit Scholarship

Awarded on the basis of results of H.S.C. Examination. Students securing at least 60% of marks are eligible to apply. The value of the Scholarship is Rs.40/- per month.

v) Post Matric Scholarship For SC & ST Students

Stipends are given to the S.C. and S.T. students by the T.R.W. Department, Government of Odisha, provided they are not employed.

vi) Stipend to Children of Freedom Fighters

Awarded on the basis of annual H.S.C. and annual CHSE Examination to the bonafide child, stepchild or adopted child of a freedom fighter / bonafide refugee from Pakistan permanently residing in the State of Odisha and grandchildren through predeceased sons.

vii) Scholarship for Teacher's Children

Awarded to the children of Primary Teachers, High School Teachers and Secondary School Teachers and Secondary School Teachers on the basis of results at the H.S.C. Examination. The annual income of parents shall not exceed Rs.25.000/-.

viii) Stipend for Physically handicapped Students

These are awarded to lame, deaf and orthopedically handicapped students whose age is between 17 to 30 years. The students must have secured at least 40% of total marks in H.S.C. Examination for eligibility.

ix) Concessions to Children of military Personnel

Educational concessions are given by Govt. of Odisha to the children of military personnel (Army / Air Force / Navy) and paramilitary personnel (B.S.F. / T.A./O.S.A.P.) who were killed / permanently disabled / declared missing during Indo – Chinese hostilities of 1862, Indo-Pak wars 1965 and 1971 and Defence Personnel of IPKF in Srilanka.

x) Hindi Scholarship

Every Year Govt. of India awarded 119 scholarships to students for non – Hindi speaking states for post matric studies in Hindi. Students continuing the studies in +2 and +3 classes are eligible to apply subject to the condition that they have passed previous examination taking Hindi as a subject and Hindi should have been taken as one of their subjects in present course of study. Students passing compartmentally are not eligible.

N.B.: Student can avail any one scholarship at a time. If she/he will select for more than one scholarship, she/he must inform this matter in proper time.

B) FREE STUDENTSHIP

- 1. Free studentship is awarded every year to poor and meritorious students to the extent of 12.05% of the total number of students on the rolls of college on the basis of recommendation of Free Studentship.
- 2. Full free studentship is awarded to a student whose parent / brother is serving in the Army. For such help the concerned student has to produce certificate from the Commanding Officer.

C) AIDS FROM SOCIAL SERVICE GUILD AND STUDENT AID FUND

Poor and meritorious students are given financial assistance from Social Service Guild and Student's AID Fund for payment of tuition fees, payment of examination fees, purchase of books etc. on the basis of recommendations of respective committees.

24. Examination

A) THE ODISHA CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION ACT 1988

An act to provide for penal action for adoption of unfair means at certain examination held in the state and other matters connected therewith.

B) COLLEGE EXAMINATION

- 1. The College conducts 1st Terminal & Annual Examination for students of 1st year Higher Secondary and Pre-Test and a Test Examinations for students of 2nd Year Higher Secondary, 1st year Degree, 2nd Degree and 3rd year Degree classes. The First Terminal and the Pre-Test Examinations are held either before or after the Puja Vacation. The Test Examination is held in December and the Annual Examination is held in April-May. Besides, Periodical Tests are conducted by the Departments for Honours Students.
- 2. College examination are important as Council / University examination and on no account should these examinations be avoided or treated lightly. Students of +3 1st year, 2nd year and +2 1st year, 2nd year streams must appear at either in the 1st terminal or annual and pass in the said examination failing which they will not be promoted to the next higher class or to filling up University / C.H.S.E. Examination Form.
- 3. Request for appearing at college examinations will not ordinarily be entertained in exceptional circumstances an application for exemption from appearing at an examination, duly supported by a medical certificate in case of illness and recommended by the Proctor may be considered by the principal.
- 4. Absence from examination, without permission, will be penalized in a manner to be determined by the principal.
- Permission to sit for the Council / University examination or promotion to the next higher class depends upon the performance of a student in the College examination, besides securing the requisite percentage of attendance and good – conduct.
- 6. Students will not be allowed to enter the examination hall half an hour after commencement of the examination.
- 7. No student will be allowed to leave the examination hall during the first hour of the examination.
- 8. Students must bring their Identity Cards with them when they appear at an examination.
- 9. Adoption of unfair means, misconduct and acts of indiscipline are serious offence and will render a student liable for punishment as the Principal may deem fit.

C) UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

All students and staff of the college are members of the Planning Forum. The principal is the Ex-Officio President and Head of the Department of Economics is the Chairman of the Forum. The Secretary of the Planning Forum is nominated by the President.

FUNCTIONS

To organize meetings, seminars and symposia on planning.

25. OUR PUBLICATIONS

A) THE COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The College Magazine, entitled "RUSHIKULYA" is published annually. Articles written by student and members of staff find a place in the College Magazine. All contributions to the magazine must be original and must have actually been written by the contributors since our aim is to explore and encourage the potentialities of matters. Selection of articles for publication by the Board of Editors is final.

B) THE COLLEGE CALENDAR

The College Calendar is a comprehensive collection of useful information pertaining to the College. It serves as a hand book for the students.

C) WALL MAGAZINES AND PERIODICALS

These are maintained / published by different Graduate and Post Graduate department.

26. NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The N.C.C. in this College functions in two separate wings. The Army Wing (infantry and the Naval Wing, students interested to join in N.C.C. may contact the concerned N.C.C. Officer.

27. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Three N.S.S. units each with an enrollment capacity of 50 students, directly controlled by the Berhampur University, function in the college students with an aptitude for social service are enrolled as N.S.S. volunteers at the beginning of the academic session. A member of the teaching staff acts as the Programme Officer for each N.S.S. unit, each unit has adopted certain villages as its area of operation and conducts special campus during vacations.

28. YOUTH RED CROSS SOCIETY.

A Red Cross Society functions in this college under the supervision of a Counselor nominated by the principal from amongst the members of teaching staff. Membership of Society is open to all the students of the College who desire to participate in its programme of activities.

29. THE PLANNING FORUM

- i) There is a Planning Forum in this College. The main aim of this Forum is to spread plan consciousness among the students and through them in the community.
- ii) To organize education trips, socio economic surveys and community welfare work.
- iii) To make students aware of the implications of planning.
- iv) To seek suggestions from enlightened sections of the public, member of the staff and students.
- v) To assist the Planning Commission in various ways such as starting small savings drive.
- vi) To make humble efforts to make planning a success.
